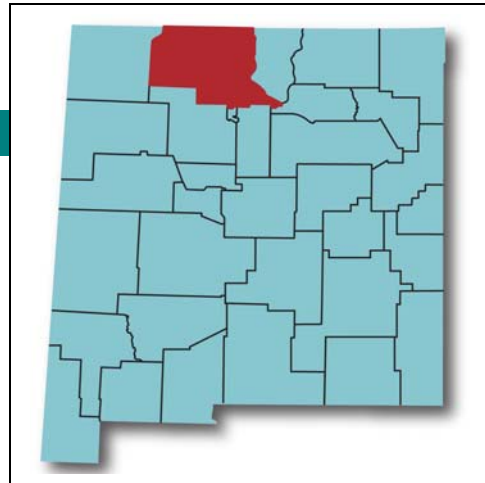


RIO ARRIBA COUNTY

Demographics

Rio Arriba County includes the incorporated communities of Española and Chama. The County totals 5,860.8 square miles, with a 2010 population density of 6.9, compared to 17 persons per square mile statewide. The population decreased by 2.3% between 2000 and 2010; New Mexico's population increased by 13.2%. The median age was 34.5 in 2010 compared to 36.7 for the state.

In 2010, 24.6% of the total population was under the age of 18; and 14.1% over the age of 65. Statewide these percentages were 25.2% and 13.2%, respectively. The per capita personal income (PCPI) in Rio Arriba County in 2010 was \$28,615, a 2.14% increase over 2009. New Mexico's PCPI in 2010 was \$33,342, increasing 2.94% from 2009. Sources: U. S. 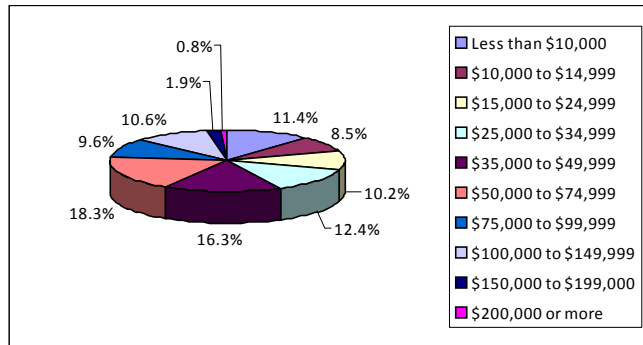

Households & Housing

The 2010 median household income in Rio Arriba County was \$41,437 compared to \$43,820 statewide. 2.7% of the households reported an annual income over \$150,000. The home ownership rate in the County was 79.8% and the median value of owner occupied housing units was \$136,300. In New Mexico the home ownership rate was 69.6% and the median value was \$158,400 (2006-2010 5-year estimates).

Workforce

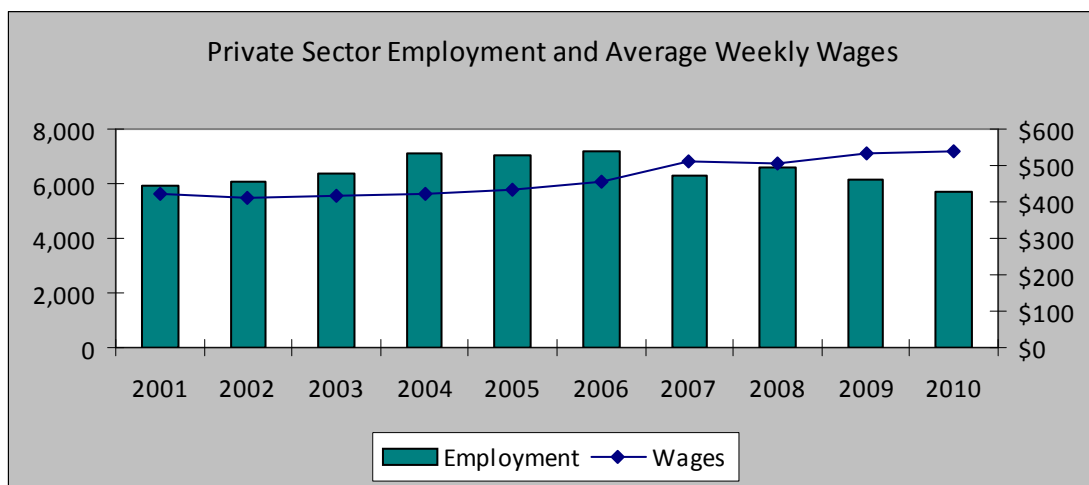
In January 2012 the total workforce in Rio Arriba County was 18,559: 17,004 employed and 1,555 unemployed. The unemployment rate was 8.4% compared to 7.3% statewide. The 2010 average wage per job in the County was \$30,954, representing a 1.34% change from 2009. New Mexico's 2010 average wage per job was \$40,199, a 2.19% increase from 2009. Total net earnings in 2010 in the County were \$653 million, a .92% change from 2009. Statewide, total net earnings increased 3.69% between 2009 and 2010. Among the population 25 years and older 78.6% had at least graduated high school and 16.1% had a bachelor's degree or higher. Statewide these percentages were 82.7% and 25.5%, respectively.

Total school enrollment in 2010 was 9,195: high school enrollment was 2,265 and college or graduate school enrollment was 2,265. Among the population five years and older, 37.4% spoke English only, 62.6% spoke a language other than English, and 55.3% spoke Spanish. The total Spanish speaking population was 20,666 (2006-2010 estimates).
